TESTING

Applicants to Kindergarten participate in a one-on-one evaluation in January and a playgroup in February. The evaluation and playgroup are designed to determine a child's readiness for the St. Gabriel's Kindergarten program. The Admissions Office will schedule these required appointments after the application is received.

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

Students are selected on the basis of their pre-reading and pre-math skills, developmental readiness for the St. Gabriel's program, their social, emotional, and physical maturity as appropriate for their age, and their ability to contribute to a diverse and well-rounded class. It is understood that the St. Gabriel's program is not appropriate for every child and that the Admissions Committee is not only deciding what is best for the school, but more important, what is best for the child.

ADMISSIONS DECISIONS

Admissions decisions are mailed on March 9, 2012 to candidates whose completed applications are received by the priority deadline: January 13, 2012. Families are asked to inform St. Gabriel's of their enrollment decision by March 23, 2012. Applications received after the priority deadline will be considered as space permits.

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FACT SHEET

Mission

St. Gabriel's Catholic School educates students in a challenging environment that fosters character formation through scholastic excellence and physical, emotional, and spiritual growth. Our goal is to instill in each student a lasting love of learning and a lifelong commitment to Christian values and service.

Background

St. Gabriel's is a coeducational school for grades pre-kindergarten through eight. The school, founded in 1999, is a non-profit organization governed by a Board of Trustees and operated under the authority of the Head of School. The existing campus accommodates a 430-student population.

Educational Philosophy

St. Gabriel's provides a child-centered learning environment that celebrates each child's individuality while fostering excellence in the arts, academics and athletics. Excellence is achieved by addressing both the student's strengths and weaknesses. The legacy of the educational programs at St. Gabriel's lends itself to a mastery of content, creative problem solving and a love of learning.

At St. Gabriel's, however, we believe academic excellence alone is not enough. The truly educated child must acquire knowledge and develop virtue. Therefore, St. Gabriel's is committed to instilling in each child the Cardinal virtues of Prudence (Sound Judgment), Justice (Responsibility), Fortitude (Personal Courage), and Temperance (Self-Mastery).

The Catholic culture at St. Gabriel's provides a safe and nurturing environment for our students to practice these virtues, as well as the theological virtues of faith, hope, and love. The virtues taught at St. Gabriel's are meant to instill in our students a spirit of generosity and lifelong commitment to family and community.

Accreditation

St. Gabriel's is accredited through the Independent School Association of the Southwest (ISAS) and the Texas Catholic Conference Education Department (TCCED) and holds membership in the National Catholic Education Association (NECA), the National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS), the Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools (TAPPS), the National Middle School Association (NMSA), the Texas Association of Non-Public Schools (TANS), the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development (ASCD), the National Council of Teachers and Mathematics (NCTM), the National Council of Teachers of English (NCTE) and Independent School Management (ISM).

Student Population

A regional school, St. Gabriel's serves students from all over the Austin area. The majority of the student body is Roman Catholic; however, children of all faiths are welcome.

St. Gabriel's is committed to serving a diverse student population and seeks to recruit students from different ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds. A financial aid program to ensure diversity was established with the support of the Catholic Diocese of Austin in 1999. In addition, the Sister Thecla Cain Academic Scholarship Fund was established in 2001, whereby seventh graders are eligible to apply each year for the two merit-based scholarships awarded for the eighth grade.

Our admission policies appreciate differences in students and promote an ethic of caring. The admission committee evaluates applications based on each child's potential to succeed in St. Gabriel's unique and challenging educational environment and the students and parents' ability to commit to an environment rooted in Christian ethics.

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Curriculum

The curriculum includes the following academic subjects: language arts, mathematics, science, social studies, religion, and foreign language, as well as art, music, technology, and physical education. St. Gabriel's uses the goals and objectives of the Texas Education Agency and the Texas Catholic Conference Education Department as a baseline for instruction. The school curriculum extends these standards in developmentally appropriate ways and provides additional educational offerings to extend and enrich all subjects.

Extra-Curricular Activities

As enrichment to the basic disciplines, all students can participate in a variety of after-school activities. Although the specific offerings vary from year to year, activities abound from the arts to science and have included Chess Club, Mad Science, Boy and Girl Scouts, tennis, drama, piano instruction, and math enrichment.

The school's athletic programs thrive with a "no-cut" inclusive philosophy for teams. The programs promote physical fitness and encourage participation, teamwork and sportsmanship.

St. Gabriel's is an active member of the Austin Inter-Parochial League and fields both competitive and inclusive teams from the fifth through eighth grades in soccer, basketball, tackle and flag football, and volleyball, as well as participating in league track meets and golf and tennis tournaments. Club sports, such as lacrosse, are also offered to students in fifth through eighth grade.

Spiritual Life

St. Gabriel's fosters in our students a relationship with God through the teachings and devotions of the Catholic Church, in order to affect moral character, teach the joy of more meaningful relationships, and ultimately, create a lifelong desire for service to others. By understanding the teachings of Christ and accessing the graces which result from a personal encounter with God, students will be better equipped to understand the happiness one experiences in living a virtuous life.

Facilities

The campus is located on 32 acres of rolling hill country in a residential area of southwest Austin. The education building has a central commons facility, chapel, library, gymnasium, dining area, computer laboratory, classrooms for Pre-Kindergarten through Fifth Grade, and dedicated classrooms for Spanish, music, art, and science. The newest addition to our facility, Knotts Hall, features a full science laboratory, art studio, wireless technology, and spacious classrooms for Sixth through Eighth Grade. The extensive outdoor athletic complex includes a football field with a perimeter track, a multi-purpose field, tennis courts, and a covered playground facility for lower school children.

Community Service

The school participates in extensive community service activities each year in order to promote a sense of ethical responsibility in our students. In addition, students may participate in leadership and enrichment programs, including Student Council, Honor Society, mathematics and science competitions, and various student clubs.

Community Support

St. Gabriel's is special because of the dedication and generosity of many people. The facilities and programs were a gift by founding families and it is both an honor and a privilege for each new St. Gabriel's family to help continue this heritage.

The school is financially independent from the Diocese of Austin and operates without monetary assistance from state or local governments. Annual tuition does not cover the actual cost of educating each student. All parents play a vital role in supporting and sustaining St. Gabriel's through a variety of charitable giving programs.

- Well-rounded curricular and co-curricular programs, including the arts
- Small grade-level environments and low student-teacher ratios allowing for increased individual attention
- Parent partnership and involvement
- Learning is valued by students; it’s cool to be smart
- Complete control of educational mission and programs
- Freedom to act decisively and quickly when needed
- Education of the whole child: virtue and manners matter
- First-class facilities
- Innovative and differentiated school program
- A safe and healthy environment
- Receives no public funding

What are the differences between a private or independent school and a public school?

Since St. Gabriel’s does not receive public funding it is independent from public education mandates and regulations, school boards, unions and state agencies. This means that St. Gabriel’s has the authority to determine, implement, and evaluate the entire educational program for the school and make all personnel decisions and desired changes.

The leadership at St. Gabriel’s is provided by an appointed Head of School and a self-perpetuating Board of Trustees who are invited to serve, and are not elected by the residents of a public school district. The school’s mission, educational principles, and practices, not popular opinion or majority vote, dictate the school’s direction and programs.

What are the differences between an independent Catholic School (St. Gabriel’s) and a Diocesan or Parish School?

Diocesan or parish schools are church-affiliated which means they receive and are dependent upon financial support from a local church and/or a Diocese. As an independent Catholic school, St. Gabriel’s is financially independent of the Diocese of Austin. And, because we are not affiliated with a particular Catholic parish, we are not part of a parish’s operating budget.

Also, while parishes or churches must distribute their resources among several ministries because they have multiple priorities and obligations, including a school, St. Gabriel’s can focus solely on the educational and spiritual development of its students. This singular commitment is reflected in the quality of the faculty, facilities, extensive educational and spiritual programs and opportunities available to St. Gabriel’s students.



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WHAT IS AN INDEPENDENT CATHOLIC SCHOOL? (CONTINUED)

Finally, though financially independent of a local church and the Catholic Diocese, St. Gabriel's Catholic School operates under the auspices of the Bishop and receives accreditation from the Texas Catholic Conference Education Department (TCCED) which assure that it maintains a clear and strong Catholic identity. And though St. Gabriel's does not have a church on the school property, it does have a chapel with a Eucharistic presence open throughout the school day for all members of the community. In addition, St. Gabriel's is fully accredited by the Independent School Association of the Southwest (ISAS).

Why is St. Gabriel's tuition higher than that of a Catholic parish school?

While Diocesan or parish schools subsidize the cost of tuition with monies received from the church collections and the Diocese, St. Gabriel's must set the tuition closer to the actual cost of educating each child.

Does St. Gabriel's welcome non-Catholic students?

Yes, all faiths are welcome at St. Gabriel's! In fact, 27% of the students at St. Gabriel's are not Catholic. As a Catholic school we are a community of openness and inclusivity. Indeed, the root of the word "Catholic" (katho likos) means "universal" or "embracing all." As Cardinal Avery Dulles, S.J. observes: "To be truly Catholic, in the literal sense of the word, is to be universal and open to all truth and goodness from whatever source it may come."

When students and families from diverse backgrounds join our school community, they add richness and depth to our journey. As we open our minds, hearts, and spirits to others we grow in our understanding of ourselves and one another. In this movement out of our personal experiences, we begin to appreciate the rich and varied gifts present not only in our school community, but also in the larger world outside of St. Gabriel's. At the same time, we ask that all parents and students support the mission of St. Gabriel's and appropriately participate in our Catholic traditions regardless of their particular faiths.

Why would a non-Catholic family choose an independent Catholic school like St. Gabriel's?

Families who choose a private, Catholic education seek an academic community with a commitment to excellence, service and a spiritual and moral center. Catholic, private schools have served American families since the 17th century often preceding the first public educational institutions. Competition between public and private schools has strengthened both, while guaranteeing that families have a meaningful alternative for their children's education.

The specific reasons for a non-Catholic family to select St. Gabriel's, in particular, for their child's education are: (1) The extraordinary faculty (2) The academic advantage and commitment to excellence in all areas of school life (3) The programmatic emphasis on virtues, service and leadership (4) The freedom to express and discuss religion and values (5) The innovative and differentiating school programs and opportunities (6) The strong focus on preparing world-ready citizen leaders.

How is the quality of St. Gabriel's evaluated?

Two accrediting bodies evaluate the school's mission, identity, instructional programs and practices: the Texas Catholic Conference Education Department (TCCED) (www.txcatholic.org) and the Independent School Association of the Southwest (ISAS) (www.isasw.org). St. Gabriel's has received full accreditation from both agencies.
